Embroidery Floss Charm Ring

Organize your embroidery floss with handmade recycled bobbins.



Here's what you'll need:

- Recycled thin cardboard packaging
- Canvas (small pieces)
- Embroidery floss
- Fray check or clear nail polish (optional)
- Eyelets
- Eyelet setter
- Binder rings



Here's what you'll do:

Cut strips of cardboard approximately 1" wide and 7" long.



Fold the strips in half. Punch a hole through both sides of the open ends, and cut a slit in the folded ends.



Slide one end of embroidery floss in the slit on a bobbin, wrap around the bobbin, and slide the loose end through the slit.



On pieces of canvas stitch words to organize your embroidery floss. I stitched the words “neutral”, “warm” and “cool” freehand. You could divide the floss by colors: “reds”, “blues”, etc. Also you could use my alphabet embroidery patterns.



Trim the tags, and if desired, seal the edges with fray check or clear nail polish.

Follow the instructions on the eyelets and eyelet setter to finish the tags.



Loop a binder ring through a tag and all corresponding floss bobbins and find yourself a little more organized!
